On behalf of the club I want to welcome our newest member Wally Wentworth and I hope that all you have sent in your dues for 2004. Last year we had a membership roster of over 90 members, lets see if we can top that figure this year.

I want to thank Allan AE2J for representing the club at the ARRL Hudson Division Club Presidents Meeting. Allan reported back to the club the developments that are occurring with the proposed incentive licensing restructuring and the mentor program that will accompany it. At our February meeting Dave Ellenberg WA2KWP gave an informative talk on stealth antennas. Dave lives on the 10<sup>th</sup> floor of an apartment building in midtown Manhattan and has been very successful using a variety of stealth antennas and indoor antennas to work hundreds of DXCC entities. Dave prepared a great handout with lots of information and he brought in some of the antennas he uses at home. With the limited time we have at our meeting we just scratched the surface of the many aspects of antenna design and construction. Dave would like us to remember the big four in antenna selection: Height, Resonance, Capture Area and Earth/Ground. What I got out of talk was that experimenting and figuring out what you need to operate is at the heart of this hobby and no matter what your situation may be you can operate if you want to!

The day after the meeting, I received the March issue of QST and one of the articles was on indoor antennas. The author gave some brief descriptions of the antennas he uses but what was the most interest to me was that he has worked 257 countries and now has 250 confirmed using indoor antennas and 100 watts. This is a feat that many operators don't achieve even with outdoor antennas and more power.

At the February meeting the repeater committee announced that they had cleaned, fixed and reassembled the repeater and it was back in operation A

big thanks goes out to Marc WR2I, Ted KC2HEV and Sidney KC2GEC for their time and effort in getting the repeater on line. The repeater still needs some fine tuning and I have been told a new duplexer. I am confident that the repeater committee will address these issues shortly and have a report ready for the club on improvements that have to be undertaken to our machine.

The club's conduit and cable replacement project is progressing nicely. At the time of this writing all aspects of the conduit run have been completed and the donated cable is at the hall. We are awaiting a shipment of coax from Nebraska and hopefully we will be pulling cable by mid March. After the cable is pulled and connected, the club will enter into phase II of our project which is the clean up, rearranging and installation of more counter space in the shack.

Phase III will involve reworking all the antennas on the roof in the summer months. I want to thank all those individuals who have worked on the conduit project to date: Bernie K2ZIR, Steve WB2KGD, Ted KC2HEV, Terry KC2JOJ and Art WA2YQV. After this project is over this list will grow substantially. I will be calling a work party shortly if the cable arrives before our next meeting, so don't have anyone at home answer the phone for you and say your not home when in reality your watching TV on the couch, I'll find out anyway.

Activities for March include our Road Trip to the Timonium, Maryland Hamfest on Saturday the 27th. I need a list of drivers and the capacities of their vehicles as well as a list of those who need a ride so I can coordinate the driving roster by the next meeting. Additionally there has been talk of setting up a club table at the Hamfest with all interested parties manning the table for an hour at a time. If you have equipment you want sell please let me know and we can work out an arrangement for a tailgate space. I am sure you all have heard by now the good time we had last year on this trip and I'm hoping this will make more of you want to join us this year.


